

# **Contest know how**

It's time for the Miranda Toastmasters Club's annual Evaluation and International Speech contests, scheduled to take place on Tuesday, 12 November 2024.

The **International Speech Contest** is one of the key contests on the Toastmasters' calendar. It's an exciting event where members get the chance to give inspiring and powerful speeches. As its title suggests, the winner of this contest could potentially take the winner all the way the World Championship of Public Speaking.

Not to be left out, the **Evaluation Contest** is another important contest where Toastmasters show their skills in delivering constructive feedback on a test speaker's speech. Contestants offer clear, supportive, and helpful evaluations. Winners of the Club Evaluation Contest have the potential to advance through the Area, Division and District contests.

What do you need to know to prepare for these contests and present your best material?

We've provided some educational material to help you learn more about the contests, including an excellent article written by former Miranda Toastmasters member, Greg Kennedy DTM. Greg won the District 70 International Speech Contest and represented District 70 at the 2010 International contest in Palm Springs, where he made it to the semi-finals. ### Pathways training


Training sessions on the new platform will be offered later in the year, including at our next group mentoring session in November. TableTopics and Humorous Speech contests on 14 October.

Helen Blanchard was the first woman to join Toastmasters International in 1970, when membership was restricted to men. She was encouraged to join by other members and used the name "Homer". She became the first female president of Toastmasters International from 1985–1986. She was a trailblazer who paved the way for women to join Toastmasters.
