S.E.E. what I did there?

Delivering empowering evaluations



At Toastmasters we evaluate everything. As part of the speech-making process, It's what we do.

Structure: A well-organised evaluation follows a clear framework, like the traditional 'CCRC' method—Commend, Commend, Recommend, and Commend. This ensures the feedback flows logically, making it easy for the speaker to absorb and act on. Begin by identifying and highlighting what the speaker did well, then offer specific, actionable recommendations, and wrap up with a positive, motivating and empowering conclusion.

Encouragement: Great evaluations strike the right balance between praise and constructive feedback. While it's important to give suggestions for improvement, always recognise the speaker's strengths. This encouragement builds confidence, making them more receptive to suggestions and eager to improve.

Empowerment: The best evaluations are delivered with empathy and should empower the speaker. Be mindful of the speaker's level of experience and how they might feel receiving feedback. Tailor your tone and words to be supportive and motivating, ensuring the speaker leaves with a sense of accomplishment and a clear path for improvement.

By focusing on S.E.E., your evaluations will be clear, constructive, and compassionate—helping speakers thrive.

Meet a member



Mike Smith

Mike has been a Toastmaster for 15 years and held many committee positions and he has had great success competing in club, Area, Division and District speaking competitions.

Q. Describe your new role at Miranda Toastmasters Club

This year I'm the Vice President Membership (VPM), which is responsible for assisting new members to join and to help existing members have a rewarding Toastmasters experience.

Q. How do you think you can add value to the role and the Club?

I'm hoping to add value by establishing a routine/process to support both new prospects and members. I figure that a role that's time-effective to perform is easier to do well. I want to do a good job in the role, but also make the role easier for future VPMs.

Q. Why did you join Toastmasters?

At the time (2009) I was interested in becoming a better public speaker. I'd done a fair bit of speaking/presenting for work, but felt that I didn't really know what I was doing.

Q. What do you hope to achieve through Toastmasters?

Nowadays I really enjoy helping others become more confident and capable. I don't have any lofty goals for my own speaking anymore 😉

Q. How has being a part of Toastmasters impacted your personal or professional life?

It has really helped by work as a consultant by giving me many skills. I am now very confident when 'put on the spot', and I've learned many techniques for building connection with my audience. An important skill that I've learned is how to hear what I'm saying through the listener's ears – so I can land my messages more effectively. I feel I'm a much better communicator than I was.

Q. What tips to overcome the fear of public speaking can you give to newcomers?

Fear of public speaking can be dissolved by identifying what it is that you're actually scared of. Once you've done that, you'll find that EVERYTHING that you can identify can be overcome/avoided with preparation. So, the tips are 1) explore your fears to find out what they specifically are, then 2) work out what you can do to avoid them.

Q.Can you share a memorable speech or project you've worked on?

My favourite times have been on the District 70 stage. The last few times I've really connected with the audience, and it felt like I was having a one-on-one conversation with 250 people at once. It's a very special feeling.

Q. If you could have any superpower, but it could only be used for mundane tasks, what would it be and why?

Being tidy. I always have many things on the go, and my study and workshop display the evidence of that fact.
